## The End of Sex and the Future of Reproduction

In 20 to 40 years, most people around the world with good health coverage will conceive their children not through sex but in a fertility clinic. “Easy Preimplantation Genetic Diagnosis” (Easy PGD) will allow parents to make embryos from his sperm and her skin cells in order to get whole genome sequence results. With these results, parents will be able to select which embryos to transfer for possible implantation, pregnancy, and birth.

What are the economic, social, political, and legal factors that might make this technology the future of reproduction?
