

Child and Adolescent Psychologist – Outpatient Clinics

The Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at Stanford University is seeking a Pediatric Psychologist for a full-time faculty position in the Clinician Educator line to provide clinical care and teaching. The chosen candidate will serve as an attending psychologist in the capacity of a super-clinician, providing clinical service including initial evaluations, consultation, and evidence-based treatment, including brief, individual, and family therapy to child and adolescents in the outpatient clinics. The primary assignment will be in two specialty clinics within the Child and Adolescent Outpatient Clinics, Mood Clinic and General Clinic (ADHD and Disruptive Behaviors). Stanford Medicine Children's Health provides exposure to a wide range of scholarly and community outreach activities including clinical working groups, parent education and support activities. The super-clinician will focus primarily on providing clinical care.

Eligibility criteria for this position include a doctoral degree from an APA-accredited graduate program in clinical or counseling psychology, APA-accredited clinical psychology internship, at least one year of post-doctoral clinical training in child and adolescent psychology, and licensure or license-eligibility as a psychologist in the state of California.

Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience, and ranges from \$140,000-\$270,000.

This position commands a competitive salary enhanced by an attractive benefits package, including but not limited to competitive compensation including home purchase programs, bonus programs, and vacation time, as well as comprehensive benefits include health/dental/vision, paid malpractice, and 403(b) plans.
