

Smoking Health Map Activity

Purpose & Preparation	Procedure
<p>Purpose:</p> <p>Students will create a visual infographic or video illustrating tobacco’s health impacts on the entire body and the consequences of smoking during pregnancy.</p> <p>Students will complete independent research on health consequences of using tobacco, including consequences for mother and child if tobacco is used during pregnancy.</p> <p>Materials Needed: Students will need access to materials to complete independent or group research (i.e., internet, library, etc.)</p> <p>Handout:</p> <p>CDC Infographic</p> <p>Source Credibility Factsheet</p>	<p>Procedure:</p> <p>This activity has two parts:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Student Research 2. Creation of Infographic or Public Service Announcement <p>PART 1: Student Research (20-40 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will complete research on tobacco health impacts independently or in small groups.
