Stanford TEP Course

This course is a “hands-on” workshop designed to give SLP’s, MD’s, nurses and PA’s the opportunity to learn how to place and remove the prosthesis used for TEP speech. In addition, the course will cover the history of the prosthesis, surgical procedures, management of complications, heat and moisture exchangers (HME’s), tracheostoma valves, buttons and swallowing issues. The course will facilitate the development and refinement of clinical skills for managing this patient population. The instructional format consists of lectures, digital imaging, discussion, live demonstrations and hands-on practice.

As a result of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Demonstrate prosthesis insertion methods
- Name two criteria for patient candidacy for TEP speech
- Demonstrate placement of an HME system
- List solutions to common problems in managing the valve
- Name three products available to TEP speakers to aid in managing the valve
