Afraid to delete a slide?

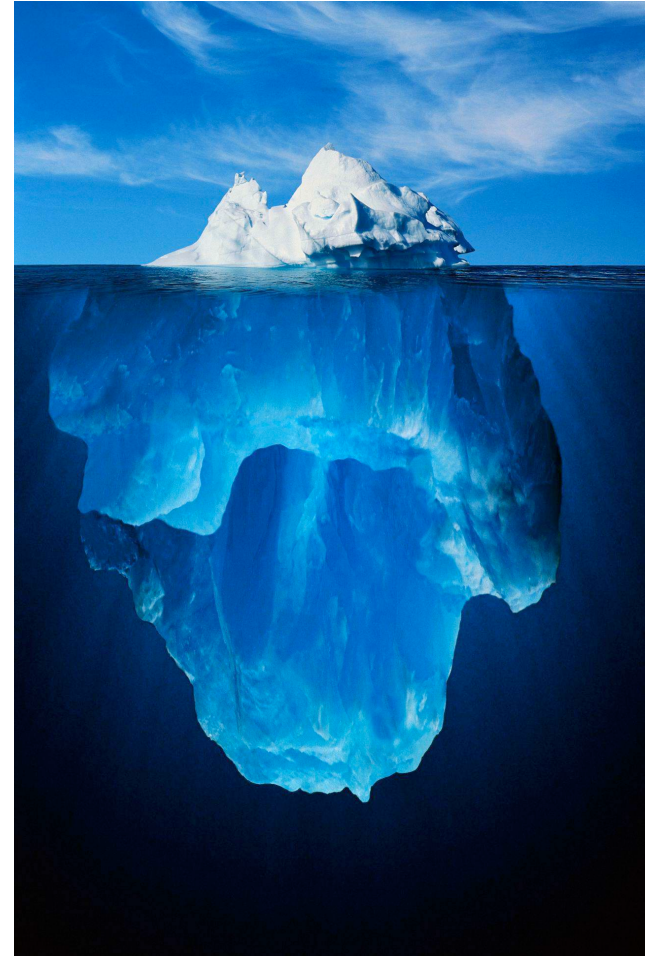
Hide it behind your "final" slide

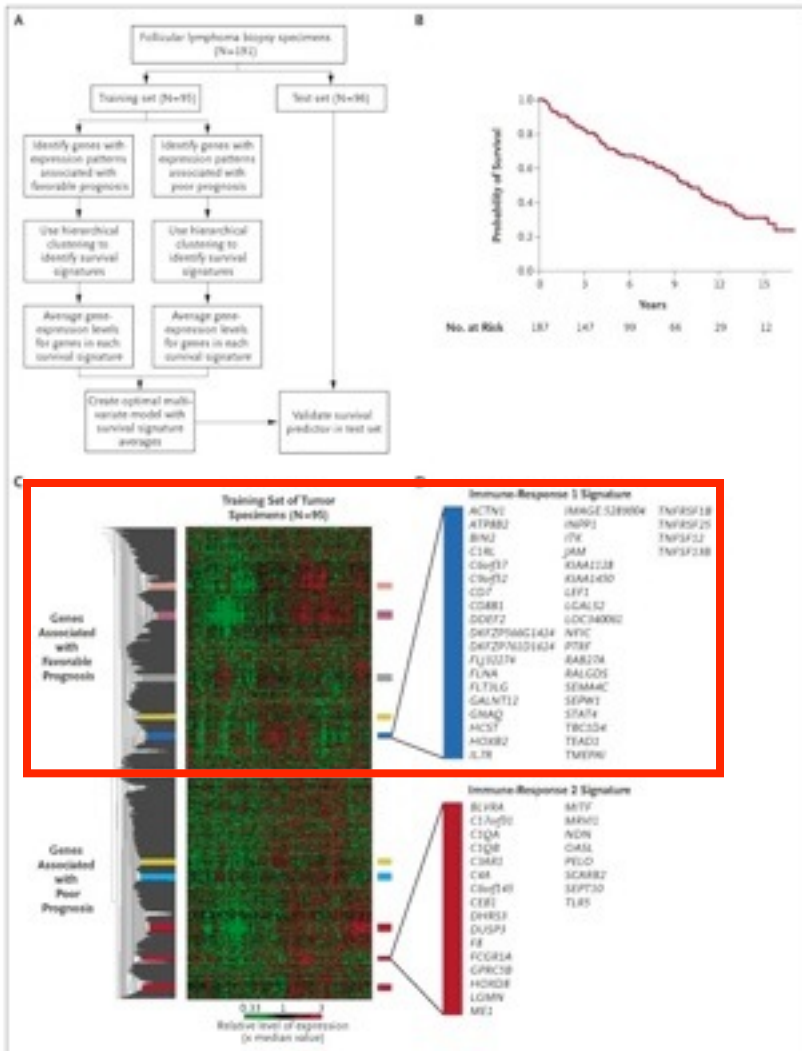
Death in the Afternoon

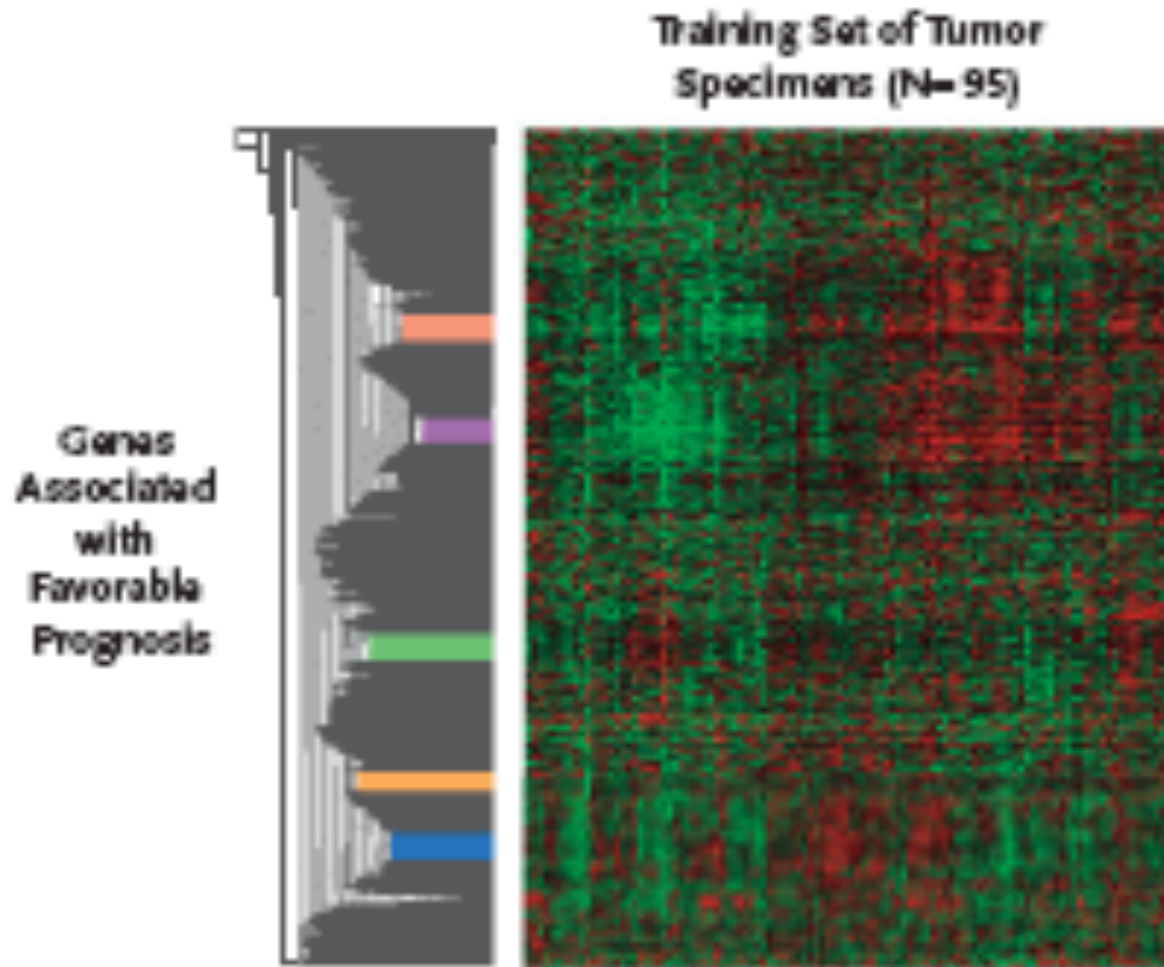


5. Don't stuff slides with lots of stuff

Brains sleep when overwhelmed

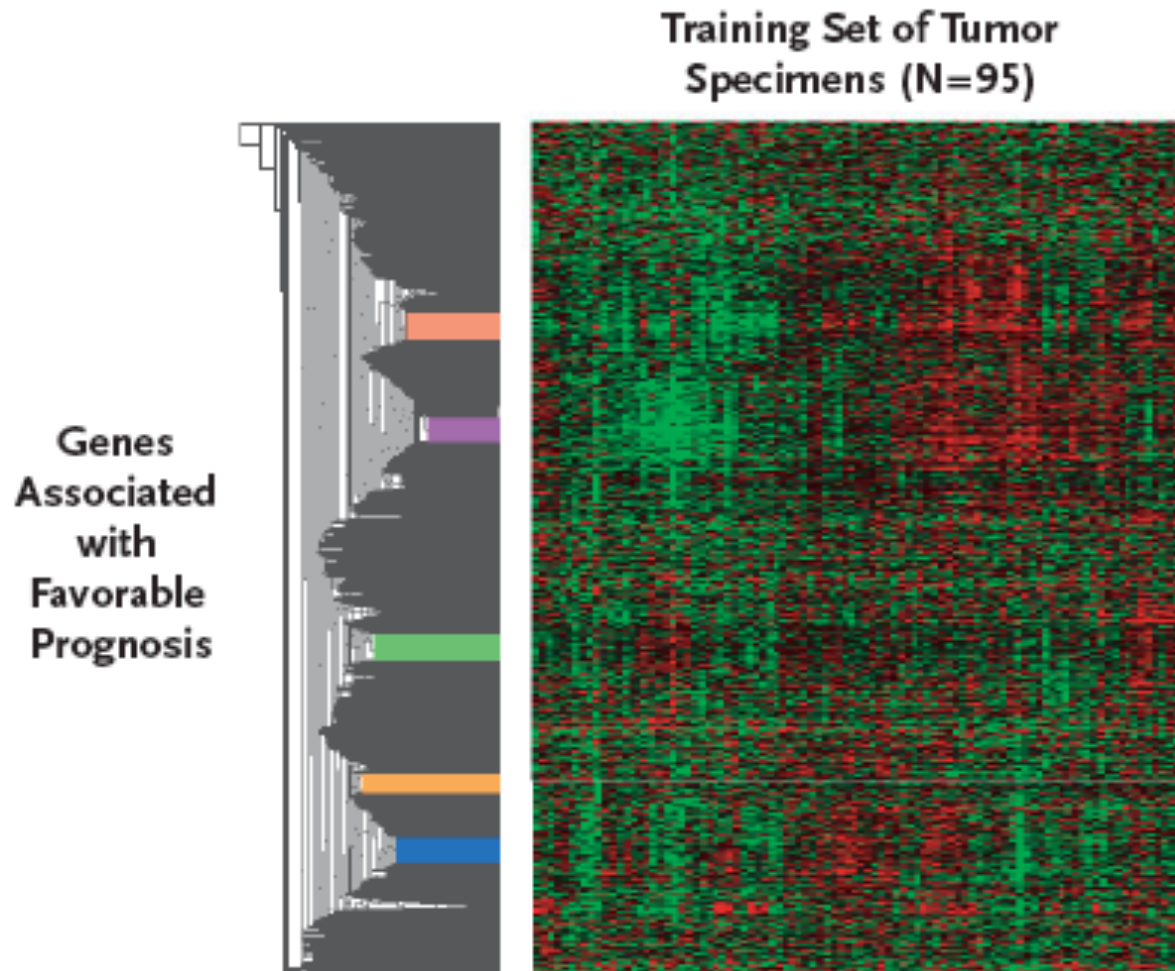

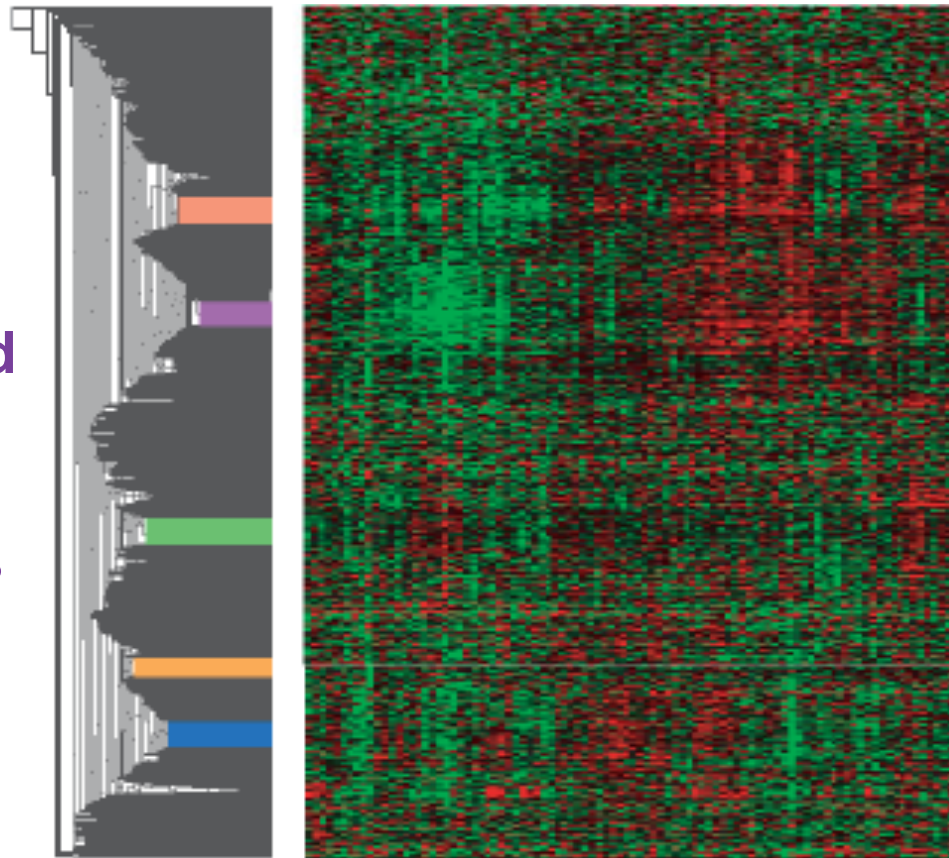


5. Don't stuff slides with lots of stuff

Training Set of 95 Tumors

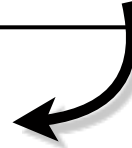
Genes

Prognosis



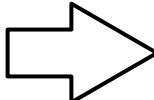
6. Don't show muddy messages

- Homologous to Daphne

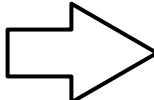

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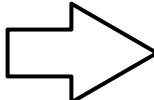
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Avoid passive sentences

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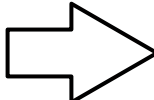
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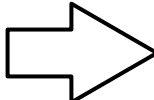
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Eliminate extra information

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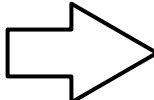
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Eliminate extra information

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- Homologous to Daphne

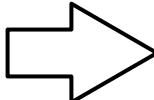
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Construct each item in the same way

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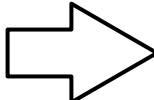
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- Interacts with Daphne
- Shares homology with Daphne

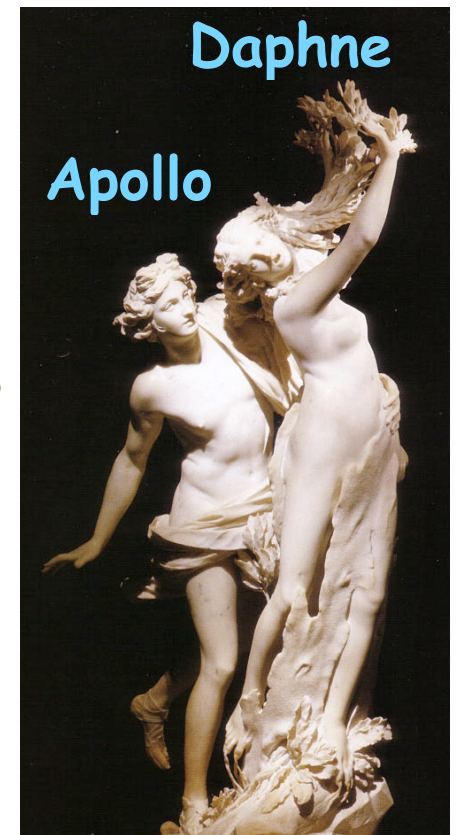

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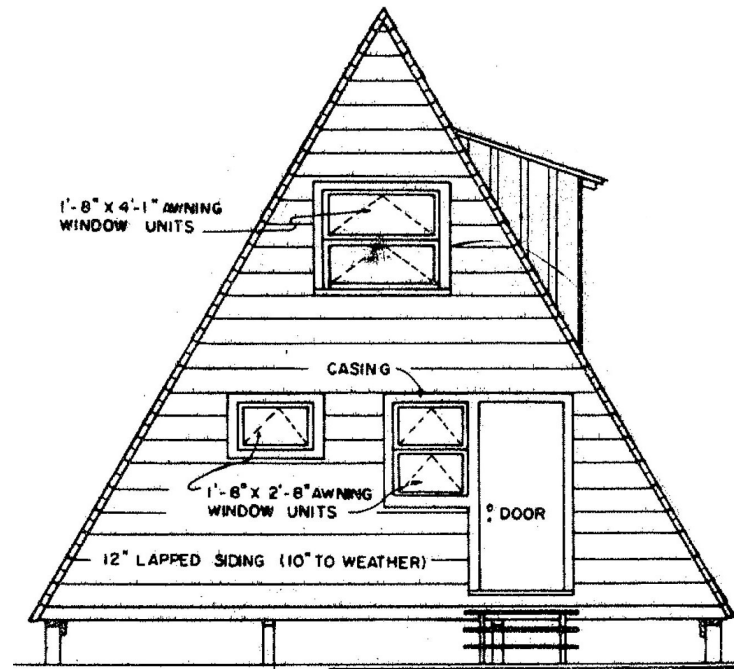
