DEPARTMENT OF NURSING RESEARCH AND EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE

The ICP award offers up to 200 hours of MCHRI Clinical Research Coordinator (CRC) services to assist with tasks such as IRB applications, regulatory documents, subject identification, recruitment, enrollment, data collection, specimen handling, quality control, adverse event reporting, data entry, and regulatory oversight. All applicants must submit a brief MCHRI CRC Intake Form at least 8 weeks before the full proposal submission. A consult, with a Clinical Research Manager, will be scheduled to plan how to best use the 200 hours, providing a PDF summary. Any grant submissions without a CRC intake consultation will not be reviewed or may be asked to resubmit in the next cycle.
