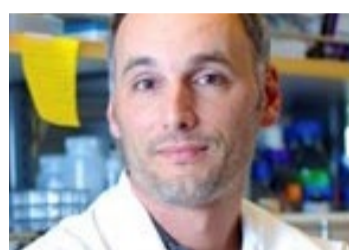


#NextGreatDiscovery: Telling the story of science at risk

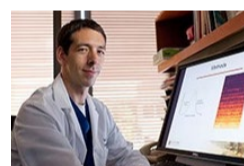
Giving Matters
