

RECRUITING PARTICIPANTS! BLACC PEER NAVIGATION PILOT STUDY

A community-university partnership between Black Ladies Advocating for Cancer Care (BLACC), Charlotte Maxwell Clinic (CMC), and Stanford School of Medicine to implement and refine a BLACC peer navigation program for patients with breast cancer and survivors of breast cancer developed by and for Black women.

DESCRIPTION

The BLACC Peer Navigation program is a pilot research study of a community-university partnership between Stanford, BLACC, and Charlotte Maxwell Clinic.

The program will be focused on **supporting Black women who have breast cancer or are survivors of breast cancer.**

BLACC is a group formed **by Black women for Black women** to address breast cancer health disparities that Black women face.

The BLACC Peer Navigation Program will be offered at the **Charlotte Maxwell Clinic** in Oakland for six months.

PROCEDURES

This study includes :

- Meeting with the peer navigator at least weekly for the first month followed by at least monthly for up to six months.
- Participating in surveys and interviews to understand your experience in the program.
- Receiving free complementary integrative services for the duration of the 6 month study.

ELIGIBILITY

- Self-identified Black/African American Women
- Breast cancer patient OR survivor
- Willing to travel to CMC for services

BENEFITS

- Social and emotional support
- Informational resources
- Advocacy and empowerment in dealing with healthcare professionals
- Integrative care services (eg: acupuncture, massages, etc)
- Up to \$50 for survey completion
