This position may include teaching and supervision of doctoral students and Clinical Psychology Postdoctoral Fellows. Opportunities for scholarly/clinical research contributions are available within the department but are not a required part of the position. Faculty rank will be commensurate with the qualifications and expertise of the successful candidate.

Applicant requirements: 1) a doctoral degree in psychology, clinical or counseling, 2) completion of an APA-accredited internship, 3) licensed as a psychologist in California or be fully eligible for licensure as a psychologist in California, and 4) experience providing evidence-based treatments for eating disorders.
