The Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Stanford University School of Medicine is seeking a full or part-time faculty member to provide clinical services and teaching in the outpatient Stanford Addiction Medicine Dual Diagnosis Clinic. This position requires skills and experience in addiction treatment, organizational management, and teaching. It may include a research component if desired by the chosen applicant, but research is not required. The ambulatory outpatient Addiction Medicine Dual Diagnosis Clinic includes medication assisted treatment (MAT) for substance use disorders, and individual and group psychotherapy. This faculty position includes supervision of trainees rotating through the clinic, including addiction medicine fellows, psychiatry residents, and medical students.

This position is open to psychiatrists. Candidates must have a medical degree (or equivalent), be licensed or license-eligible in California, have an X-waiver license to prescribe buprenorphine, hold board certification or be board eligible in Addiction Psychiatry or Addiction Medicine, and have significant experience in the diagnosis and management of patients with addictive disorders. Ideally, the candidate would have experience and interest in teaching as well.

The chosen candidate will be appointed in the Clinician Educator faculty line. Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience.

The major criteria for appointment, reappointment and promotion for faculty in the Clinician Educator faculty is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care and clinical teaching.
