Mitch combines his interest in sexual and gender minority (SGM) health and technology to design and deploy digital solutions for address issues related to participant engagement, recruitment, and retention. Mitch is the co-director of The PRIDE Study, a national longitudinal cohort study of SGM adult health, and co-principal investigator of PRIDEnet, a national community engagement network focused on catalyzing SGM health research.
