

## What Do You Know/Want to Know About Hookah? Activity

<u>Purpose &amp; Preparation</u>	<u>Procedure</u>
<p><b>Purpose:</b></p> <p>This activity will allow students to discuss information they have heard or learned about hookah and list any questions they have about hookah.</p> <p>This will give the educator a sense of what students already know and would like to know, and students will be able to track what they learn as the class moves through activities.</p> <p><b>Materials Needed:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Computer</li> <li>• Internet Access</li> <li>• Projector</li> <li>• Large Sheets of Paper</li> <li>• Markers</li> <li>• Print out of Brainstorm Worksheet</li> </ul> <p><b>Handouts:</b></p> <p><a href="#">Brainstorm Worksheet</a></p>	<p><b>Procedure:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Brainstorming (15 minutes)</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Using the handout “<b>Brainstorm Worksheet,</b>” ask students to list what they know or have heard about hookah.</li> <li>b. Then, ask students to list questions they have about hookah.</li> <li>c. As you go through the following activities, have students track which statements listed are true or false.</li> <li>d. Have students answer the questions they listed once the information is covered in the activities.</li> <li>e. The handout can be filled out by students individually or projected and filled out together as a class.</li> <li>f. Any statements or questions not covered in the following activities can be researched and answered by students as a homework assignment.</li> </ol> </li> </ol> <p><i><b>Teaching Note:</b> This brainstorming activity can be done with small groups if time allows or as a whole class to save time.</i></p>
