

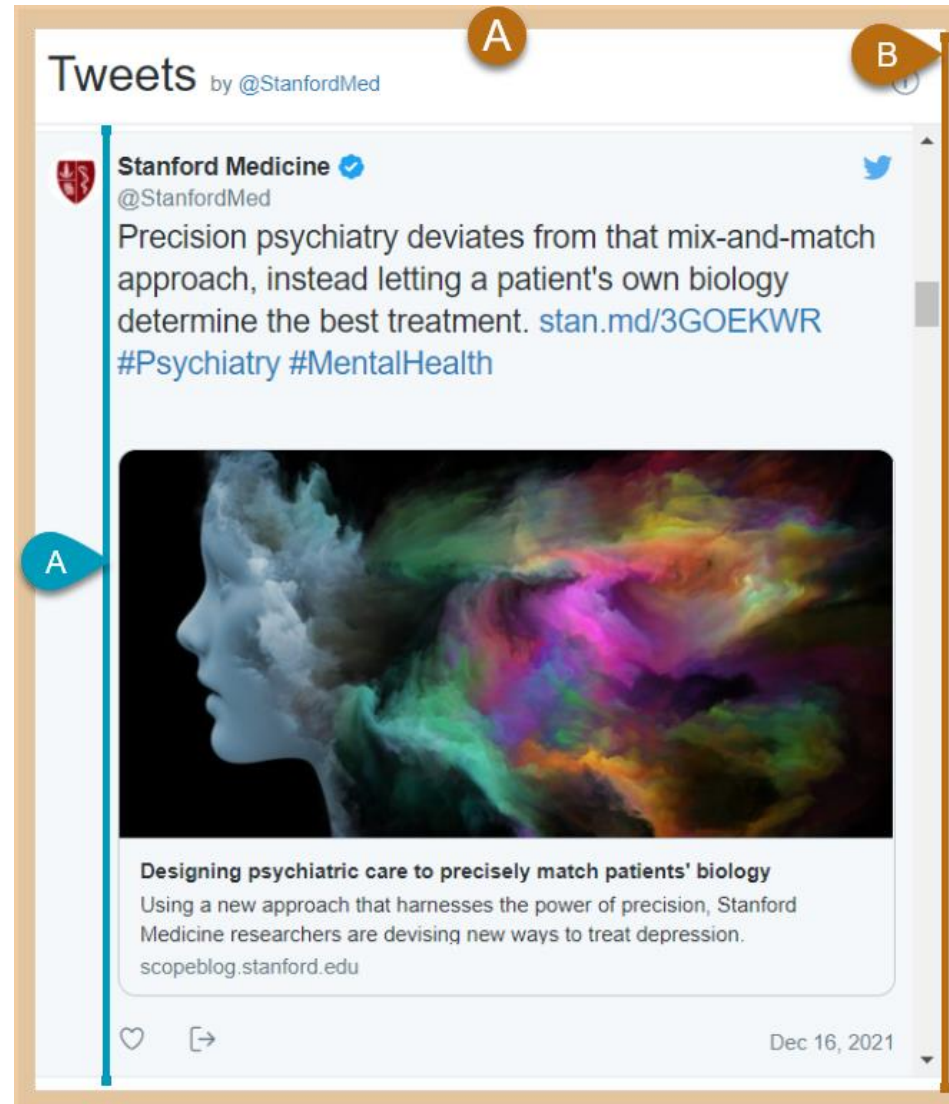
Twitter Timeline

The Twitter Timeline provides an easy way to embed a dynamic Twitter feed into pages. The feed can be setup as a user, list, or custom widget created directly in Twitter.

Features

- Multiple embed options
- Live updates
- Custom visual adjustments

Embed a feed of Twitter content directly into your page



Pro Tips

- Use Twitter's custom widget to get more granular (e.g. specific hashtags)
- Define height to better fill the space

Setup Essentials & Legend

Timelines can be generated from a variety of **methods (A)...**

i. Username

Insert the username, not including the @. (E.g. @StanfordMed becomes **StanfordMed**)

ii. Custom

Created directly in Twitter, goto <https://publish.twitter.com/>. After creation, import the generated code.

iii. List

Lists are subject-specific timelines. They can be found by appending "/lists" to the username URL. (<https://twitter.com/stanfordmed/lists>)
