How to find information on pediatric cancer clinical trials

Search on cancer.stanford.edu/trials

- > Select cancer condition "Pediatric Oncology" in the search box.
- > Or click on "Browse cancer condition" and then find "Pediatric Oncology" from the list.
- > You will find that each trial will have information about the study and a study contact.

How clinical trial referral typically works for pediatric cancer patients

Physician-to-Physician Referral

- > The patient's oncologist makes a referral to Stanford Children's Health by calling 650.497.8953 or emailing the pediatric oncology contact related to the study.
- > Physician liaisons are available to help the oncologist navigate the referral process and answer questions about Stanford Children's Health.

Parent/Guardian Inquiry

- > The parent(s)/guardian(s) of the patient can inquire about how to start the cancer referral process by calling 650.497.8953 or emailing the pediatric oncology contact related to the study.
- > The study contact will begin the process with the patient's oncologist, then contact the clinical research team related to the study.

How trial referral works for patients who live outside the United States

For patients who live outside the United States, please contact Stanford Health Care International Medical Services (IMS) to make arrangements.

- > A new patient appointment is arranged through IMS.
- > IMS must be contacted to determine what resources and insurance may be needed. This is a fee-based service, which may be covered by the patient's insurance company or by paying out of pocket.
- > IMS will review medical records, calculate costs, and arrange appointments.
