HEALTH EQUITY AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The Office of Community Engagement together with the Stanford Cancer Institute Office of Cancer Health Equity, co-sponsored by Stanford Spectrum Center for Clinical and Translational Research and Education, present the Health Equity Ambassador program this fall! This professional development program will provide training in research and selected health equity topics to a cohort of community members each year. Some of our goals include: 1) Increasing and strengthening community partnerships; 2) Driving research that is responsive to community needs; and 3)

Building research capacity in the community, particularly in the Bay Area and Central Valley. For the inaugural cohort launching this fall, the thematic focus is climate change and health equity.

The goals and opportunities of this program include:

- 30+ hours of professional development training to aid community engagement research partnerships
- Opportunity to participate in the 2024 Community Health Symposium, and
- \$6,000 of funding to support a research project driven by community needs.
